

## LONDON'S BURNING - řešení

In the evening of 2 September 1666 Thomas Farynor was in his bakery in Pudding Lane near London Bridge. He was making some bread. He put the loaves into the oven and then he went to bed. His assistant looked after them. The assistant fell asleep and at about two o'clock the bakery was on fire. A strong wind was blowing from the river and it blew the fire from house to house. After a hot, dry summer the buildings caught fire very easily, and in the narrow streets the fire spread quickly. Soon several streets were on fire. Some

people tried to **save** their houses, but it was no good. They **grabbed** their children, **money** and clothes and they ran. The streets were full of people, **horses** and carts. They **decided** to build a better, more modern city with wide, **straight** streets. The people didn't want **another** fire, so all the buildings were made of **bricks** or stone, not wood. Sir Christopher Wren built a new St Paul's **Cathedral**. Everyone agreed that it was more **beautiful** than the old cathedral. Today near London Bridge you can see the **Monument** to the Great Fire of London. It's **33** metres high, because it's **33** metres from the bakery in Pudding Lane where the fire started.
